A phrase is a group of words that cannot be a complete sentence because it is missing either a verb or a noun.

## examples:

- 1. The mangy cat from next door
- 2. Creepily smiling from the shadows
- 3. Dripping delicious chocolate sauce

#### Type #1: Noun Phrases

A noun phrase is a noun (a person, place, or thing) and the adjectives (either before or after) that describe it. They usually look like this:

## (article) + adjective(s) + noun + adjective(s)

examples:

- 1. The decaying zombie
- 2. Undead and smelly zombies
- 3. Fearsome and ugly zombies

## Type #2: Verb Phrases

A verb phrase is a a multi-word verb, that expresses more specific type of action or condition. A verb phrase can have up to four parts. They usually look like this:

helping verb(s) + main verb + verb ending (when necessary)
examples:

- 1. have devoured
- 2. will enjoy
- 3. are feasting

#### **Type #3: Prepositional Phrase**

Prepositional phrases start with a preposition and end with a noun phrase or verb phrase. They usually look like this:

preposition(s) + noun phrase or verb phrase

examples:

- 1. from under the bed
- 2. before the terrified teacher
- 3. with nasty gore
