thinking about what you are thinking as you read

Reading Strategy #1: Make connections

Three types of connections:

- a. Text-to-text: relate the book to something you have read or watched.
- b. Text-to-self: relate the book to something in your life.
- c. Text-to-world: relate the book something in the world.

Reading Strategy #2: Making Inferences

Definition: To make an educated guess about what has/will happen by taking what the author told you and adding to it what you know about the topic.

Formula:

What the author said | what you know = inference

Inference Example

Solomon wants to live more than he wants to escape. . .

- a. He has not tried to escape in over 7 years.
- b. Slaves who were desperate to be free sometimes died trying to escape.

Reading Strategy #3: Asking Questions:

<u>Definition:</u> Think like a teacher and ask yourself questions as you read to check your understanding.

- Type 1: Who owns Solomon in chapter #1?
- Type 2: Why did Abram & Merril kidnap Solomon?
- Type 3: Do Solomon and his wife have a good relationship?
- Type 4: Do you think it is selfish to only free your slaves after you die?

Reading Strategy # 4: Make Evaluations

-to offer your personal opinion on the book or a part of the book.

Ex. I think this book deserves 1-5 stars because . . .

Reading Strategy #5: Make Predictions

<u>Definition:</u> make an inference about what is going to happen in the future (in your book.)

ex. inference: Miller and are not honest.

prediction: Miller and (will) betray Solomon.

Reading Strategy #6: Visualize

-to create a mental picture of what you are reading

Example: Imagine what he looked like when Solomon came out of the swamp.

Reading Strategy #7: Summarize

-to retell something and focus on the most important points

Use Context Clues

-if you don't know a word, use the words around it and your understanding of grammar to figure it out. Nov^{N}

Ex. Solomon's wife was in a quandary because she didn't know where to look for him.

quandary: a difficult situation
